1. LOVE

1) Where there is love, there is no darkness.

Meaning:-

Meaning:-

A physical attack may injure me but a verbal attack cannot injure me.

115) Silence means consent.**Meaning:-**

The idea here is that if you don't disagree, you automatically agree. Keeping quiet is the same as giving permission.

116) Say well or be still.**Meaning:-**

If you cannot speak good of someone or something, then it is better not to speak.

117) No reply is best.**Meaning:-**

It is often advisable not to give any answer. Don't say no. Don't say yes. Say nothing.

118) Never speak ill of the dead.**Meaning:-**

Show respect to people who have died by not saying anything bad about them. Since dead people can no longer hurt us, or defend themselves, it is better to forget their bad actions and remember only their good ones.

119) Least said soonest mended.**Meaning:-**

When we do or say something bad to someone, a long apology and discussion does not help. In such a case, the less we say the better.

120) Dumb dogs are dangerous.**Meaning:-**

People who say little or nothing are more dangerous than people who speak a lot.

121) Brevity is the soul of wit.**Meaning:-**

The real art of speaking (especially when speaking humorously) is to use as few words as possible.

122) A still tongue makes a wise head.**Meaning:-**

Someone who does not talk much, but listens to other people, probably has experience, knowledge and good judgment.

4. FOOLS

123) A wise man doesn't need advice, and a fool won't take it.

Meaning:-

It means that a wise man is experienced and learned enough to make his own decisions thereby not needing advice from anyone else. They disregard the person giving advice and think that only they are right.

124) Advice when most needed is least heeded.

Meaning:-

Advice is something that wise men don't need and foolish people won't take; and the greater the need for advice, the less likely the foolish person is to heed it - that is, to pay careful attention to it.

125) Cheap is dear in the long run.

Meaning:-

It means is if you buy something very cheaply, you pay dearly for it later, like if it doesn't work for long and you have to pay more to get it repaired, or you have to buy another, or you have to spend a lot of time messing with it.

126) Confess and be hanged.

Meaning:-

Guilt must be confessed and the due punishment accepted for true repentance.

127) Cut off one's nose to spite one's face.

Meaning:-

To describe a needlessly self-destructive over-reaction to a problem.

128) Empty vessels make the most noise.

Meaning:-

It means those with the least knowledge and least talent are the ones who often speak the loudest and the most.

129) Facts do not cease to exist because they are ignored.**Meaning:-**

The meaning of the statement is that facts although ignored many time by people but, in actuality they are the real source of information that we must not be ignored.

130) Fools rush in where angels fear to tread.**Meaning:-**

That means inexperienced people jump into situations that wiser, more experienced people avoid.

131) He that loves glass without a G, take away L and that is he.**Meaning:-**

He that will eat the kernel must crack the nut. He that will not when he may, when he will he shall have any. He that will thrive must rise at five; He that hath thriven may lie till seven.

132) If the cap fits, wear it.**Meaning:-**

Used as a way of suggesting that someone should accept a generalized remark or criticism as applying to themselves.

133) In one ear and out the other.**Meaning:-**

It means that heard but quickly forgotten.

134) People who living in glass houses should not throw stones.**Meaning:-**

It means that "One who is vulnerable to criticism regarding a certain issue should not criticize others about the same issue."

135) Pride comes before a fall.**Meaning:-**

If you're too conceited or self-important, something will happen to make you look foolish.

136) Pride feels no pain**Meaning:-**

Generally used of someone who is so determined to be fashionably dressed that any accompanying discomfort is not felt.

137) The bigger they are the harder they fall.**Meaning:-**

It means that to emphasize that the more important or powerful a person is, the more difficult it is for them when they lose their power or importance.

138) The hood does not make the monk.**Meaning:-**

The proverb means that the wearing of such a garment does not turn a man into a monk.

139) There's no fool like an old fool.**Meaning:-**

It means that to say that a foolish old person is especially foolish because an old person should have learned from experience not to make the kind of mistakes a young person makes.

140) Use not today what tomorrow will need.**Meaning:-**

This proverb means that it will never "be" tomorrow, because when tomorrow arrives, it becomes "today."

141) You cannot lose what you never had.**Meaning:-**

If you were never in possession of something, you cannot regret its loss.

142) A cigarette is a pipe with a fire at one end, a fool at the other, and a bit of tobacco in between.**Meaning:-**

If you smoke you should stop or reduce the amount you smoke.

143) A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion.

Meaning:-

It means that if you are only interested in your opinion and do not seek to understand what other people think, you are a fool.

144) Even fools are thought wise when they keep silent; with their mouths shut, they seem intelligent.

Meaning:-

It means that if a person is staying quiet and not speaking, they might be viewed as wiser than when they speak and say something stupid.

145) Everyone has a fool in his sleeve.

Meaning:-

No one is always right, and no one is always wise.

146) Only fools and horses work.

Meaning:-

This proverb simply means that people who make a living without working hard, are smart. It suggests only a foolish person has to work and those who are knowledgeable and resourceful don't need to.

147) Fool me once, shame on you; fool me twice, shame on me.

Meaning:-

One should learn from one's mistakes.

148) Fools rush in where angels fear to tread.

Meaning:-

Inexperienced people become involved in situations that more intelligent people would avoid.

149) The mouth of a fool brings ruin near.

Meaning:-

This contrasts the speech of the fool with the knowledge of the wise. A fool does not care about learning. He's too busy talking.

150) Whoever utters slander is a fool.**Meaning:-**

The fool will speak poorly of other people rather than be known as an encourager.

151) Doing wrong is like a joke to a fool.**Meaning:-**

A foolish person does not take sin or its consequences seriously.

152) The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice.**Meaning:-**

The fool rejects the advice of others and instead listens only to himself.

153) A fool flaunts his folly.**Meaning:-**

A foolish person is proud of his wrong actions.

154) A fool is reckless and careless.**Meaning:-**

A fool does not plan ahead but rather lives life without considering the impact his actions have on himself and others.

155) A fool despises his father's instruction.**Meaning:-**

The foolish person will not listen to his parents or obey them. In fact, he spurns what his father says.

156) As a dog returns to its vomit, so fools repeat their folly.**Meaning:-**

A fool is known for repeating mistakes rather than learning from past wrongs.

157) An empty vessel makes much noise.**Meaning:-**

Foolish or stupid people are the most talkative.

158) Only a fool tests the depth of the water with both feet.**Meaning:-**

It is not wise to jump into a situation before thinking about it. Wherever a man goes to dwell, his character goes with him.

159) What one fool can do, another can.**Meaning:-**

160) Too much prosperity makes most men fools.**Meaning:-**

Success brings foolishness.

A person who is free of evil deeds and thought, full of virtue, will have no enemies and nothing to fear so will be able to sleep well at night, where a criminal or spiteful person will not.
